		 FY 2016 Year-End Summary (Comparison to FY 2015): Overall net patient revenue growth: 8% Payor mix declined for BCBS and Commercial payors. Increase in Medicaid and Self-Pay down. Salaries at 3% increase due to growth in the clinic network. Supply costs (ortho implants) elevated materially due to the increased orthopedic cases. All other expenses at .5%. FY 2016 Operations loss at <\$960k>, improvement of \$600k over FY 2015. Retirement Plan Funding Eligibility of the retirement plan is based on 1 year of service, must be 18 years or older and have worked 501 hours during the plan year. The Board discussed and approved retirement plan funding at 2%. Questions were addressed on the 2% basis.
