Dosher Reveals Name of Mako Robot, Announces Contest Winners

SOUTHPORT—On Thursday November 10th, Dosher Memorial Hospital hosted a "Meet Mako" reception to give the community an up-close look at the hospital's orthopedic surgical robot, hear from hospital leaders and the orthopedic surgeons performing robotic surgery at Dosher, and to reveal the winner of the "Name the Robot Contest." Dosher received 84 initial name submissions, and five contest judges appointed by hospital CEO Lynda Stanley gave each name a numerical score, with the three highest scoring names, Arthur, Mack, and Rosie, then released for a community vote. Arthur, with 45 votes, was the winning name, with Mack and Rosie receiving 27 and 25 votes respectively.

Six (6) different contestants submitted the name Arthur, and therefore, six (6) first place prizes were awarded to the following contestants:
