More than 150 households, others participate at Dosher drug drop

SOUTHPORT—One hundred motorists and one dozen pedestrians dropped off close to 5,700 expired or unwanted narcotic pills at Dosher Memorial Hospital's semiannual Operation Medicine Cabinet today. Area residents also dropped off more than 1,700 milliliters of narcotic liquids.

The discarded medications came from 153 households, businesses and organizations. One of the motorists said some of the pills he dropped off dated back to 2003.

In addition to 12 Dosher employees, staff from Coastal Horizons Center and New Hanover County Health Department, and volunteers from Brunswick County Sheriff's Department helped collect the medications. Dosher thanked Southport Police and the Sheriff's Department for onsite law enforcement support.

The next collection of unwanted prescription medications at Dosher is planned for Thursday, October 4, 2018.
